Policy Statement:

Finger Lakes Community College (FLCC) is committed to providing a safe and healthy environment for all students, employees, and visitors. Therefore, FLCC shall be designated as a smoke-free and tobacco-free facility and no person shall carry a lighted cigar, cigarette, pipe, any form of smoking object/device including operating e-cigarettes and vaping devices or engage in active/passive tobacco use in any College building, College vehicle, off-campus College facility or on any outdoor property controlled by the College within 500 feet from buildings owned and/or controlled by the College.

Reason(s) for Policy:

Finger Lakes Community College joins the American College Health Association (ACHA) in supporting the findings of the Surgeon General that tobacco use in any form, active or passive, is a significant health hazard. The College recognizes that environmental tobacco smoke is classified as a Group A carcinogen by the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). As a result, Finger Lakes Community College has adopted a policy addressing reduction of smoking and the use of tobacco in any form.

Applicability of Policy:

This policy applies to all College employees and students, and all campus visitors and vendors. All College employees and students should be familiar with this policy.

Definitions:

Tobacco: Any product made or derived from tobacco or which contains nicotine, intended for human consumption, including, but not limited to cigarettes, cigars, hookah smoked products, bidis, kreteks, electronic smoking devices/electronic cigarettes, electronic aerosol delivery systems, and smokeless tobacco and snus.

Vape/electronic smoking device/electronic cigarette/aerosol: An electronic smoking device that, when activated, produces an aerosol that may be inhaled. This includes any component, accessory and/or any liquid or other substance to be aerosolized, whether separately sold. Includes all electronic smoking devices, electronic cigarettes, and electronic aerosol delivery systems, regardless of nicotine and/or other drug content level.
